Pilots extend streak with weekend sweep

The LSU Shreveport Pilots extended their win streak to five games this weekend with victories over Huston-Tillotson 84-82 and 11th ranked Our Lady of the Lake 86-78. The pair of wins pushed the Pilots record to 7-5 in the Red River Athletic Conference and 15-6 overall.

Friday nights double overtime win against Huston-Tillotson was possibly the Pilots most thrilling game of the season. The game was the third of the last five that LSUS has gone into overtime at The Dock.

After trailing by ten points midway through the second half, the Pilots battled back to force overtime behind the scoring punch of Joseph James and Lyndale James, who combined for 39 points in the contest.

"Lyndale was once again huge in the post for us. He has consistently given us a double-double over the last few weeks and hats off to him on another outstanding performance tonight," Coach Blankenship said of James, a 6'6"

sophomore, who was named last week's Red River Athletic Conference Player of the Week.

Once in overtime the Pilots took control. This has become a knack for the team as they now hold an impressive 3-1 overtime record on the season. Josh Walker and Rashard Owens put the game away late with clutch free-throws to secure the victory.

The Pilots would parlay Friday night's momentum into a huge upset victory of Our Lady of the Lake.

LSUS shot the ball very effectively throughout Saturday's game at 52-percent. Josh Walker led the team in scoring with 19 points including 9-12 from the free-throw line. Lyndale James chipped in another double-double with 14

points and 10 rebounds in the contest. The Pilot defense also managed to force Our Lady of the Lake into committing 24 turnovers.

The game set an LSUS record for the number of fouls called during a regulation time game with 66 total fouls. Five players were forced from the game with foul trouble. With that many fouls, free-throwing shooting was crucial to the eventual outcome of the game and LSUS shot 38-50 from the line

The Pilots will now go on the road for their next five games before returning to The Dock on February 20. The next game for LSUS will be Jarvis Christian on February 5.

Lady Pilots dominate from start to finish

The LSU Shreveport Lady Pilots got a pair of huge conference victories this weekend against Huston-Tillotson 90-74 and 13th ranked Our Lady of the Lake 80-68. The wins boosted the ladies back above the .500 mark, with their record now standing at 7-5 in Red River Athletic Conference play and 11-9 overall.

Friday night's contest against Huston-Tillotson was never in question as the Lady Pilots led from start to finish. They shot an impressive 58-percent from the field while forcing 21 turnovers.

Coming off of her fourth RRAC Player of the Week award, sophomore Kourtney Pennywell continued to be a dominate force for the Lady Pilots. She posted 28 points and six rebounds to lead the way for LSUS. Ariel Harrell also contributed 21 points on nine of 15 shooting.

Performing against Huston-Tillotson's zone defense was key in the Lady Pilots victory.

"I liked how we handled the zone defense with composure,' said head coach Valerie Huizar. "We've worked on it all week and the team we play tomorrow is a zone team as well, so I feel confident our team is ready."

Ready they were. The Lady Pilots continued their assault against the zone defense on Saturday night, as they shocked Our Lady of the Lake.

Our Lady of the Lake was intent on bringing full-court

pressure early in the game. The Lady Pilots showed they were up to the task and continually broke the press forcing OLLU to abandon their game plan.

Junior point guard Sierra Contreras was great throughout the game. She continually stayed calm under the pressure from OLLU and found her teammates for six assists in the contest. Contreras also had four steals asserting herself on the defensive end of the floor as well.

Kourtney Pennywell continued to bolster her claim as the Red River Athletic Conference Player of the Year with a huge 28 points, 14 rebounds, three steals, three blocks performance.

A big win like this one is about much more than just a player or two. Coach Huizar made that clear after the game.

"It was an all-around team effort tonight," stated Huizar. "The coaching staff and players were all on the same page. We stuck together and weathered their runs and just kept fighting. This was a great win against a good and well coached program."

The Lady Pilots next game will be on the road against Jarvis Christian February 5.
